The Board reviewed the Treasurer's tax collected reports.

ROAD FUND TOTAL

Larson moved for the adoption of a resolution transferring monies from the General Fund to the Road and Special Road Funds. 2nd by Steckel. Roll call vote; yes; Larson, Steckel, Ruppel. Nays; none absent; none not voting; none. Said resolution can be found in Commissioners Record No. 10 Page 295.

Caleb Johnson of J13 Enterprises LLC met with the board to propose an agreement to continue providing budget services. The proposal included a \$300 increase over last year and did not include the one time build out fee we paid last year. Johnson spoke to the board about LB 644, what is coming in legislature, how funds work if a transfer needs to be made, consolidating unused funds and where to deposit the LATCF grant money and plans for Opioid Recovery funds. County Attorney Jason White spoke to Johnson about roadmen keeping timesheets. Johnson recommended calling Pam Bourne with NIRMA. Points made by County Attorney White about keeping accurate time records included but

not limited to; disgruntled employees, policies on sick and vacation time, overtime

compensation and transparency to taxpayers.

Steckel moved to enter into the one-year agreement with J13 Enterprises for budget

services, 2nd by Ruppel. Roll call vote; yes; Larson, Steckel, Ruppel. Nays; none absent;

none not voting; none.

Commissioner Steckel notified the board and the other roadmen that her district will need

some help covering road maintenance while Sherbeck is on leave.

Commissioner Larson brought to the board information to discuss on a pickup and trailer

for the road department. Needed for transporting the skid steer, culverts etc. Information

discussed included but not limited to; what size pickup needed, tilt deck vs ramps on

trailer, gooseneck trailer, pickup with ball and tire size on trailer.

Commissioner Larson discussed with the board auto gates located on Gracie Creek

Road, he stated 5 out of the 7 need to be repaired/replaced.

Continuing discussion from last month on the road Cody Jaymes met with the board over.

There is no record of this in either Loup or Custer County being a road.

Discussed ensued over mowing and tree removal in the road ditches. Letters will be send

out reminding residents of Nebraska Statute 39-1811, 39-1812 and 39-1813, a

newspaper publication will also serve as a reminder.

Highway Superintendent Johnson presented proposed plans for the Porcupine bridge

replacement and where the new bridge will be placed. Bids for the project should be

coming in May, once a contractor is decided on it will be up to the contractor when to start

the project.

Discussion ensued about a culvert on 823rd Road that possibly needs to be replaced. It

would need to be able to handle the cleanout of the canal since this is where it is dumped.

In the meantime, delineators need to be placed at the site.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned.
